RESPONSE TO COVID 19

CORONA VIRUS “COVID -19”: Corona virus disease (COVID -19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered corona virus. Many people were infected with the virus and they will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment. Aged people and those with underlying medical problems like cardiovascular diseases, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease, and cancer are more likely to develop serious illness. The best way to prevent and slow down transmission is being well informed about the deadly virus and protect oneself and others by washing your hands or using an alcohol based rub frequently and not touching your face. The COVID -19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes, so it's important that you also practice respiratory etiquette (for example, by coughing into a flexed elbow). At, this time, there are no specific vaccines or treatments for COVID -19. However, there are many ongoing clinical trials evaluating potential treatments.

MISSION STARTED EARLIER & CONTINUES TILL NOW FOR COVID 19

MARCH 2020

21.03. 2020 : Awareness on Corona was given from 21st March, 2020 onwards to the Self Help Groups (SHGs), Grama Sangams, and ULFs. The awareness was given on invisible virus Corona and its evil effects of how it affects the human to death. The people were given hand sanitizers before attending the awareness program and everyone was given the idea about social distancing, self quarantine and they were all provided with a free face masks made by the SHGs of MSSS.



21 03 2020: Wash Programme was organized with rallies and wash kits were distributed in all the Evening School UDRR centers such as Little Mount, T Nagar and Park Town for 214 children.

23 03 2020: Awareness pamphlets prepared by TASOSS were sent to 77 Parishes 14 and ULFs of MSSS to create awareness among the people.

23 03 2020 : **Oath on Covid 19:** 352 Grama Sangams were facilitated to take the oath of staying at home, regular hand wash, maintaining the social distance and self quarantine. The people were made to talk about necessary safety measures needs to be taken to support the frontline defense for the safety of general public. These oaths were taken in the Grama Sangams



24 03 2020: **Face Mask Preparation:** Self Help Groups (SHGs) were taught to manufacture the face masks with the help of people who have learnt tailoring and they have manufactured more than a lakh. Each SHG is entrusted to manufacture at least 50. The masks were sold to various NGOs at a reasonable cost and it was not over charged. This initiative by SHGs of MSSS helped people in respective villages to access the face mask during COVID – 19.



24.03 2020 : **Face Mask Distribution:** MSSS wanted to encourage the entrepreneur opportunity opted by the Self Help Groups (SHGs) and purchased around 3000 face masks at the rate of Rs 10/- and distributed to the needy persons in the slums, women groups and street dwellers for free of cost to keep them safe from COVID -19. The people thanked MSSS for this initiative which can help them and their families from getting infected from virus attack.

24.03 2020: **Sanitizers Preparation & Distribution:** The traditional sanitizers were prepared and distributed to 1028 individuals in various slums and villages to poor which helped them to be safe during this pandemic.



24. 03 2020: Face Masks was produced by the new SHGs of UDRR project began to distribute the masks freely to needed persons in Park Town for 314 persons.

28 03 2020: At the request of our Chairperson Most Rev Dr George Anthonysamy DD STD JCL, MSSS had ordered the dry ration packages for the poor families of Thiruvellore, KG Kandigai and Periyapalam Vicariates and distributed to 1700 families @ Rs 1200/-.



28.03 2020: Face Masks and sanitizers were given to the poor people and the public servants in Puzhal areas for 687 persons.

31 03 2020: At the request of the Rajasthan Government, the starving migrants were supported in Villivakkam with dry ration packages for 31 families.

APRIL 2020

01 04 2020: Free Masks were distributed in Uthukottai with the support of local police station to 673 people.

02 04 2020: Awareness on Covid 19 was given to PwDs in Pulicat and masks were distributed to them

The people were made to understand about necessary safety measures to be taken to support the frontline defense for the safety of general public. These oaths were taken in the Pulicat and Minjur blocks to help the people understand the seriousness of COVID – 19.

3. WASH PROGRAM

Awareness on Wash: Awareness was conducted in the Evening School of about 96 Centers in Chennai and Thiruvallur district. The children and teacher were given awareness about the COVID -19 and how they should handle the situation. They were also given awareness about the social distancing and self quarantine. The children were given training on WASH so that they will practice it all throughout the phase of Corona. The WASH program was conducted in three slums including the nearby 9 slums where the people were given awareness on hand wash, health and

hygiene of the people in the slums. The people were distributed free mask which was made by the SHGs of MSSS to keep them safe from the deadliest COVID – 19.

Rally on Wash: The rally was conducted by gathering children from the slums and nearby locality. They were all given puck cards and banners to walk through the streets of the community. The children were shouting out slogans like “stay home, stay safe”.



Wash kit Distribution: The wash kits were distributed to the beneficiaries after necessary giving the training on seven techniques of hand wash. The training was initiated by the Director and later the kits were distributed at the end of the session.

4. Face Mask Preparation: Self Help Groups (SHGs) were taught to manufacture the face masks with the help of people who have learnt tailoring and they have manufactured more than a lakh. The masks were sold to various Non – Governmental organisation at a reasonable cost and it was not over charged. This initiative by SHGs of MSSS helped people in respective villages to access the face mask during COVID – 19.



5. Face Mask Distribution: MSSS wanted to encourage the entrepreneur opportunity opted by the Self Help Groups (SHGs) and purchased around 3000 masks and distributed to the needy persons in the slums, women groups and street dwellers for free of cost to keep them safe from COVID -19. The people thanked MSSS for this initiative which can help them and their families from getting infected from virus attack.

6. Sanitizers Preparation & Distribution: The sanitizer were prepared and distributed to individuals in various

slums and locality to the people which will help them to keep safe during this pandemic.

7. Food Packages Distribution: The public servants and the poor were distributed with food packages with the help of the local staffs. The food was prepared with the local vendor and well packed to be distributed to the people who are need and supporting the functioning of Madras Social Service Society various block. The people were very happy and thankful for this initiative which was taken on need based.

8. DRY RATION PACKAGES DISTRIBUTIONS:

Parishes: Madras Social Service Society covered 120 Parishes which compressed in 12 different Vicariates under Madras – Mylapore Archdiocese. MSSS has also reached about 5000 families with this initiative which was taken by Rev. Fr. Patrick I Joseph. The Vicariates Father took major efforts to reach and identify benefitting families in their Vicariates like Perambur, Egmore, Santhome, Thiruvittoru, etc.,.

Grama Sangams: The Grama Sangams is the local body administration which works for the welfare of the people in the villages. MSSS reached about 2000 families through the support of Grama Sangams in various rural villages during the lockdown. The Dry Ration kits were distributed to the people with appropriate social distancing was also practiced.

Face Mask – Grama Sangams: MSSS has also helped in the safety of the villagers by distributing 1 lakh Face Masks to various

Grama Sangams and blocks. The people were very happy with the initiative taken by Rev. Fr. Patrick I Joseph. And all the masks were purchased from the SHGs of MSSS to give them a support during this lockdown. The Face Masks were also distributed to public servants who work in cleaning the streets of village and collect garbage from households.

Kabasuba Kudineer: Kabasura Kudineer Distribution in the villages of various blocks.

The people were fed a myth that Kabasura Kudineer helps them defense from the infecting the deadly virus COVID – 19. The people were happy in the distribution of the Kabasura Kudineer in their villages. The polyherbal decoction Kapa Sura Kudineer is a well known one in this series next to Nilavembu Kudineer. And the people of Tamil Nadu are now very attentive about the Siddha drug which was earlier used to prevent the swine flu.



Vegetable Packages: The vegetables were distributed to beneficiaries in the various blocks with the help of the supporting staffs of Madras Social Service Society. The people appreciated and felt thankful for this initiative which helped them to have health vegetables to fight COVID, the vegetables were packed with the help of volunteers of the blocks.



9. Nutritional Drink of Yogurt Distributed: The Yogurt drink was distributed to children in various villages with the help of Sisters and local volunteers. The Yogurt drink was distributed to 6500 children in various blocks and villages. This nutritional drink can help the children to stay strong during this quarantine and summer. The children were very happy for distributed with Nutritional Yogurt Drink.

10. Dry Ration Packages Distributed to SHGs: MSSS supported around 2350 SHGs family in blocks like Nandiambakkam, Minjur, Pulicat, Kadambathur, Poondi, Ellapuram, Periyapalayam, Avadi, Villavakkam and Uthukottai. The SHGs has also been a huge support to MSSS during this lockdown. The Families thanked MSSS for this limitless support.



11. MSSS supported the vulnerable groups:

Tribes: MSSS identified tribes with the help of the field staffs and SHGs in the various blocks. The tribal families were suffering without any income or support, so MSSS extended the support to those families with the help of local bodies.

Dalits: The Dalits were identified with the help of local



volunteers in the various blocks. The families were struggling without any support and then MSSS has extended support to them by distributing Dry Ration to many families.

Fishermen: The Fishermen community were also in the radar of Madras Social Service Society has they were extended support by distributing Dry Rations to the families who were not maybe to make any income because of lockdown. All the families were happy about the initiative as it would help them during the quarantine.

Narikuravas: The Dry Ration was distributed to the Narikuravas in Poonamalle. There were about 300 families who have been benefitted by the initiative of Madras Social Service Society. The Dry Ration was distributed by the local body administration in Poonamalle with the help staffs of MSSS.

Slum Dwellers: The slum dwellers were identified with the help of staffs of MSSS and the identified populations were benefitted with Dry Ration. MSSS reached to more than 10 different slums around Chennai. They were all happy with the initiative of Rev. Fr. Patrick I Joseph during this lockdown. The slums were all in the heart of the city where people were struggling to beat hunger.

Migrants: MSSS also supported the migrants by distribution of masks, food packages and dry ration as per the request of Rajasthan Government's appeal but shortage of fund which was obstacle to fulfill the request as there were many other migrants from various states. The beneficiary was Mr. Prakash Meena and his group of 20 members who are at

Virugambakkam, Chennai. MSSS has also distributed dry ration package for 1000 more families. MSSS is continuing to support migrants till now.



Children: The children were also part of target group during this quarantine, as they were also distributed with nutritious drink during the summer to beat the heat. The children were also given the training on hand washing techniques to help them keep safe during the lockdown. The children were that they were also given importance during Covid 19.

Person with Disabilities: The mask and dry ration were distributed to the person with disabilities in the different villages in various blocks. The people were identified with the help of local staffs of Madras Social Service Society.

They were happy in receiving the relief items for their betterment.

12. Hallow Maiyam: Hallow Maiyam is a telephonic Counselling helpdesk which was initiated by Rev. Fr. Patrick I Joseph, Executive Director cum Secretary along with staffs of Madras Social Service Society, Chennai. This telephonic Counselling helpdesk has reached more than 850 individuals during this pandemic. It was

working from 9am to 4pm all the days of the week. The staffs were given guideline which was framed by Rev. Fr. Patrick I Joseph and they were given instruction on 8 various approaches the client would request on Counselling. 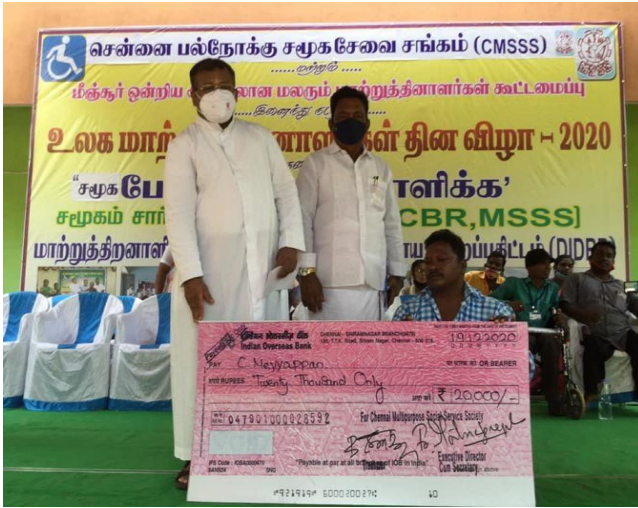
